From the Pastor..., January Devotional

Happy New Year!

You may read this before January 1st or maybe after, either way Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.

As we begin this new year, I have been searching my soul to see whether I am fulfilling the mission of the church.

Do you know the mission of the United Methodist Church? According to our Book of Discipline (pages 93-96,) the mission of the Church is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

The Process for Carrying Out Our Mission (pg. 94)—

We make disciples as we:

- -proclaim the gospel, seek, welcome, and gather persons into the body of Christ;
- —lead persons to commit their lives to God through baptism by water and the spirit and profession of faith in Jesus Christ;
- —nurture persons in Christian living through worship, the sacraments, spiritual disciplines, and other means of grace, such as Wesley's Christian conferencing;
- —send persons into the world to live lovingly and justly as servants of Christ by healing the sick, feeding the hungry, caring for the stranger, freeing the oppressed, being and becoming a compassionate, caring presence, and working to develop social structures that are consistent with the gospel; and
- —continue the mission of seeking, welcoming and gathering persons into the community of the body of Christ.

John Wesley, Phillip Otterbein, Jacob Albright, and our other spiritual forebears understood this mission in this way. Whenever United Methodism has had a clear sense of mission, God has used our Church to save persons, heal relationships, transform social structures, and spread scriptural holiness, thereby changing the world. In order to be truly alive, we embrace Jesus' mandate to love God and to love our neighbor and to make disciples of all peoples.

After reading this, I can see where I do not live up to the expectation of our Discipline.

How about you? We can only answer for ourselves and at some point we will stand before God and answer for our actions or lack of actions.

Long before I became a Pastor, I became a member of the United Methodist Church. I was twelve years old, and I didn't really understand it all. I bet some of you can relate. As I got older and became more involved, I would occasionally look at those vows and I would pray that I was understanding better and living more into those vows. As a Pastor, I continue to look at those vows and wonder what I could do differently to live into them.

Here are the vows we agreed to follow:

- —To renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness, reject the evil powers of the world, and repent of our sin;
- —To accept the freedom and power God gives us to resist evil, injustice, and oppression;
- —To confess Jesus Christ as Savior, put our whole trust in his grace, and promise to serve him as our Lord;
- —To remain faithful members of Christ's holy church and serve as Christ's representatives in the world;
- —To be loyal to Christ through The United Methodist Church and do all in my power to strengthen its ministries;
- —To faithfully participate in its ministries by my prayers, my presence, my gifts, my service, and my witness;
- —To receive and profess the Christian faith as contained in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments.

After reading these I come to realize these are not easy, but we have to work at it diligently.

As we start this new year, let us renew these vows and dedicate ourselves to these vows and to serving God as disciples of Jesus Christ so we can go into the world and make new disciples for Jesus Christ and for the transformation of the world.

In Luke 10:27, Matthew 22:36–40, and Mark 12:28–31 we are basically told: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." I believe when we live into this statement by Jesus, we get very close to being his disciple.


